13 2005; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
24

25 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for
26 the University of Arkansas Community College at Morrilton for the 2003-2005
27 biennium, the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries
28 shall be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and
29 Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and
30 all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a
31 specific maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt
32 from the provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All
33 persons occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the
34 provisions of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas
35 Code §21-5-101), or its successor.

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33 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized, for the
 34 University of Arkansas Community College at Morrilton for the 2003-2005
 35 biennium, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees,
 36 to be known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such

1 purposes: seventy-five (75) temporary or part-time employees, when needed,
 2 at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification
 3 and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate
 4 classification.

 6 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - STATE OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated,
 7 to the University of Arkansas Community College at Morrilton, to be payable
 8 from the University of Arkansas Community College at Morrilton Fund, for
 9 personal services of the University of Arkansas Community College at
 10 Morrilton for the biennial period ending June 30, 2005, the following:

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20 SECTION 4. APPROPRIATIONS - CASH FUNDS. There is hereby appropriated, to
 21 the University of Arkansas Community College at Morrilton, to be payable from
 22 cash funds as defined by Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the University of Arkansas
 23 Community College at Morrilton, for personal services and operating expenses
 24 of the University of Arkansas Community College at Morrilton for the biennial
 25 period ending June 30, 2005, the following:

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8 SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 9 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
 10 PRIORITIES. A high priority of the ~~Petit Jean College~~ University of Arkansas
 11 Community College at Morrilton shall be to provide a well-qualified workforce
 12 through quality educational programs of occupational and technical education.

13 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from ~~July 1, 2001~~
 14 July 1, 2003 through ~~June 30, 2003~~ June 30, 2005.

16 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 17 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
 18 BALANCES. The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged
 19 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the
 20 President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief
 21 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December
 22 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or
 23 will become available, to meet all current and anticipated obligations during
 24 the fiscal year for the payment of the obligations when they become due.
 25 This certification, signed by the Chair of the Board of Trustees and the
 26 President or Chancellor will be forwarded by February 28 of each year or upon
 27 release of the previous year's audit by Legislative Audit to the Chief Fiscal
 28 Officer of the State and the Legislative Council accompanied by the Board
 29 approved published annual financial statement for the preceding fiscal year.

30 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from ~~July 1, 2001~~
 31 July 1, 2003 through ~~June 30, 2003~~ June 30, 2005.

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33 SECTION 7. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
 34 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
 35 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
 36 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and

1 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
 2 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
 3 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
 4 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
 5 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
 6 with in disbursement of said funds.

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 8 SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
 9 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
 10 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
 11 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
 12 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
 13 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
 14 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
 15 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

16
 17 SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
 18 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
 19 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
 20 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of
 21 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
 22 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
 23 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the
 24 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
 25 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
 26 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
 27 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2003.
