WHEREAS, Mr. Majors was an enlisted soldier who, to this day, can clearly recall his Army service number, the method by which soldiers at the time were identified on paperwork before the use of Social Security numbers became well-established; and



WHEREAS, Mr. Majors has worked in the State Capitol Building since 1974; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Majors' kind countenance and strong faith in God make him a reassuring presence as he attends to his daily rounds; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Majors is the House's very own member of the "Greatest Generation", and all members are richer from the experience of knowing him,
