every community lies with its children; is committed to ensuring that children have the opportunities, services, and protection essential for their physical, intellectual, emotional, and social growth; and promotes the protection and empowerment of children, the health, education, and welfare of women, and the support and education of parents; and

WHEREAS, the Junior League of Little Rock's membership has contributed 91 years of volunteer service to improving the Little Rock community, and is currently focusing efforts in the next 10 years of service on creating meaningful change to improve health and wellness and school preparedness, including efforts to increase literacy and to promote better nutrition,
