HOUSE RESOLUTION

EXPRESSING THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES'S SUPPORT FOR THE BALLOT TITLES AND POPULAR NAMES SELECTED BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR THE PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS REFERRED TO THE PEOPLE AT THE 2013 REGULAR SESSION.

EXPRESSING THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES'S SUPPORT FOR THE BALLOT TITLES AND POPULAR NAMES SELECTED BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR THE PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS REFERRED TO THE PEOPLE AT THE 2013 REGULAR SESSION.

WHEREAS, at a January 23, 2014 meeting of the House Committee on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs and Senate Committee on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs, the Secretary of State stated his plan of action for the ballot titles and popular names of the three (3) proposed constitutional amendments referred to the people of Arkansas by the General Assembly at its 2013 regular session; and

WHEREAS, the Secretary of State plans to use the title of the respective joint resolution as the ballot title and will use a popular name provided by the Attorney General for that purpose; and

WHEREAS, the intentions of the Secretary of State are consistent with the intent of the House of Representatives when voting to refer the



respective joint resolutions to the people of Arkansas and reflect the law in place when the joint resolutions were adopted by the General Assembly,

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

THAT the House of Representatives expresses its agreement with the decision of the Secretary of State to use the title of each respective joint resolution as the ballot title and a popular name provided by the Attorney General.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the House of Representatives declares that the use of the title of the joint resolution as the ballot title and a popular name proposed by the Attorney General is consistent with the intent of the House of Representatives when voting to refer the proposed amendments to the people of Arkansas for their consideration.
