CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS REFERRED TO THE PEOPLE AT
THE 2013 REGULAR SESSION.

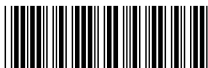
Subtitle

TO AUTHORIZE THE INTRODUCTION OF A
CONCURRENT RESOLUTION EXPRESSING SUPPORT
FOR THE BALLOT TITLES AND POPULAR NAMES
SELECTED BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR
THE LEGISLATIVELY PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL
AMENDMENTS.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

That Senator Woods is authorized to introduce a concurrent resolution
which as introduced will read substantially as follows:

"WHEREAS, at a January 23, 2014 meeting of the House Committee on State
Agencies and Governmental Affairs and Senate Committee on State Agencies and
Governmental Affairs, the Secretary of State stated his plan of action for
the ballot titles and popular names of the three (3) proposed constitutional
amendments referred to the people of Arkansas by the General Assembly at its
2013 regular session; and



WHEREAS, the Secretary of State plans to use the title of the respective joint resolution as the ballot title and will use a popular name provided by the Attorney General for that purpose; and

WHEREAS, the intentions of the Secretary of State are consistent with the intent of the General Assembly when voting to refer the respective joint resolutions to the people of Arkansas and reflect the law in place when the joint resolutions were adopted by the General Assembly,

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the General Assembly expresses its agreement with the decision of the Secretary of State to use the title of each respective joint resolution as the ballot title and a popular name provided by the Attorney General.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the General Assembly declares that the use of the title of the joint resolution as the ballot title and a popular name proposed by the Attorney General is consistent with the intent of the Senate when voting to refer the proposed amendments to the people of Arkansas for their consideration."
