HOUSE BILL 1774

## For An Act To Be Entitled

AN ACT CONCERNING THE RECORDING OF A CONVERSATION;  
AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

### Subtitle

CONCERNING THE RECORDING OF A  
CONVERSATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 5-60-120(a), concerning the unlawful recording of a conversation, is amended to read as follows:

(a) It is unlawful for a person to knowingly intercept a wire communication, landline communication, oral communication, telephonic communication, or wireless communication, and ~~to~~ record or possess a recording of the communication ~~unless~~ if the person is:

(1) Not a party to the communication or one (1) of the parties to the communication has not given prior consent to the interception and recording; or

(2) In an employment relationship with another party to the communication and all parties to the communication have not given prior consent to the interception and recording.
