WHEREAS, Mrs. Carter died tragically on September 30, 2014, while on a seemingly routine realtor sales call in Scott, Arkansas, and while following proper realtor protocol; her body was found in a shallow grave in Cabot, Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, this senseless act of violence is a tragic reminder of the hidden perils real estate agents face, potentially every day; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Carter became a realtor in August of 2003 and she was North Little Rock's top selling agent since 2008; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Carter was the fifth-ranked selling agent in Arkansas, and had earned the diamond award from the North Pulaski Board of Realtors; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Carter's many accreditations included Executive Broker, Certified Premier Property Specialist, Certified Relocation Associate, Senior Real Estate Specialist, Certified Accredited Buyer Representative, and



Graduate Realtor Institute certification; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Carter was very active in her real estate community, and was a member of the National Association of Realtors, the Arkansas Realtors Association, the North Pulaski Board of Realtors, the Crye-Leike Multi-Million Dollar Club, the North Little Rock Chamber of Commerce, and an American Home Shield Top Agent; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Carter is preceded in death by her son, Christopher Brian Carter, and her father, John Lownes; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Carter is survived by her husband of 35 years, Carl Carter, of Scott, Arkansas; her two sons, Carl Carter, Jr. of North Little Rock, Arkansas, and Chad Carter of Conway, Arkansas; her four grandchildren, Bailey Carter, Luke Carter, Chloe Carter, and Collin Carter, all of North Little Rock, with another grandchild expected to arrive in April 2015; her mother, Marlene Lownes of Pell City, Alabama; and her 2 sisters, Kathy Siegler of Alliance, Nebraska, and Tobbie Lownes of Pell City, Alabama; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Carter could be counted on by all who knew her, always with a heart of gold, and a smile and laugh that could brighten the darkest of days; and
