SENATE BILL 151

For An Act To Be Entitled

AN ACT TO REQUIRE A PERMIT FEE OF TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$10,000) FOR APPLICATIONS TO SELL WINE, SPIRITS, AND MALT LIQUOR; TO AUTHORIZE A REFUND OF EIGHT THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$8,400) TO SUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS AND NINE THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED (\$9,300) DOLLARS TO UNSUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Subtitle

TO REQUIRE A PERMIT FEE OF TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS WITH REFUNDS OF EIGHT THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED DOLLARS TO SUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS AND NINE THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED DOLLARS TO UNSUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 3-4-208(i), concerning fees for applications for permits to sell vinous (except small farm wines), spirituous, or malt liquor, is amended to read as follows:

(i)(1) There shall be an initial application fee of ~~two thousand dollars (\$2,000)~~ ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).

(2) If an applicant is successful in his or her application, eight thousand four hundred dollars (\$8,400) of that sum shall be refunded.

(3) In the event If an applicant is not successful in his or her application, one thousand dollars (\$1,000) nine thousand three hundred



dollars (\$9,300) of that sum shall be refunded.
