14 AN ACT FOR THE ASSESSMENT COORDINATION
15 DEPARTMENT APPROPRIATION FOR THE 2019-
16 2020 FISCAL YEAR.
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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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22 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - STATE OPERATIONS. There is hereby
23 established for the Assessment Coordination Department for the 2019-2020
24 fiscal year, the following maximum number of regular employees.

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6 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - STATE OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized,
 7 for the Assessment Coordination Department for the 2019-2020 fiscal year, the
 8 following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as
 9 "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes:
 10 three (3) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not
 11 to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act,
 12 or its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

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14 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - STATE OPERATIONS. There is hereby
 15 appropriated, to the Assessment Coordination Department, to be payable from
 16 the Miscellaneous Agencies Fund Account, for personal services and operating
 17 expenses of the Assessment Coordination Department - State Operations for the
 18 fiscal year ending June 30, 2020, the following:

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 15 SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - COUNTY ASSESSORS' CONTINUING EDUCATION FUND.

16 There is hereby appropriated, to the Assessment Coordination Department, to
 17 be payable from the County Assessors' Continuing Education Trust Fund, for
 18 maintaining and operating a continuing education program for County Assessors
 19 by the Assessment Coordination Department - County Assessors' Continuing
 20 Education Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020, the following:

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 32 SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION - REAL PROPERTY REAPPRAISAL. There is hereby

33 appropriated, to the Assessment Coordination Department, to be payable from
 34 the Arkansas Real Property Reappraisal Fund, for paying counties and
 35 professional reappraisal companies for the cost of reappraisal of real
 36 property by the Assessment Coordination Department - Real Property

1 Reappraisal for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020, the following:

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7 SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
 9 TRANSFER. To provide funding for the appropriations authorized herein, the
 10 Director of the Assessment Coordination Department of the State of Arkansas
 11 shall certify monthly to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the amount of
 12 funding needed each month to pay counties and professional reappraisal
 13 companies for the reappraisal of real property as required by law. Upon
 14 receipt of such certification the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall
 15 transfer on his books and those of the State Treasurer 76% of the amounts
 16 certified from the Department of Education Public School Fund Account, 16% of
 17 the amount certified from the County Aid Fund, and 8% of the amount certified
 18 from the Municipal Aid Fund to the Arkansas Real Property Reappraisal Fund.
 19 In no event shall the total amount of funds transferred as authorized herein
 20 exceed fourteen million two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$14,250,000) in a
 21 single fiscal year.

22 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2018~~
 23 2019 through June 30, ~~2019~~ 2020.

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25 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 26 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. MAXIMUM
 27 ANNUAL FUNDING FOR REAPPRAISALS/REVIEWS. Whether a county's reappraisal of
 28 real property is simply a review of existing data, or a more extensive
 29 reappraisal where every improvement is measured, funding to any county,
 30 provided through the Assessment Coordination Department, will be for the
 31 actual appraisal cost, up to a maximum of seven dollars per parcel, per year.
 32 Counties must use other taxing unit sources of revenue to provide for the
 33 cost of real property reappraisals if the cost to complete the reappraisal
 34 exceeds seven dollars per parcel.

35 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2018~~
 36 2019 through June 30, ~~2019~~ 2020.

1 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
3 TRANSFERS. After receiving approval from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
4 State, the Director of the Assessment Coordination Department is authorized
5 to transfer funds during the ~~2018-2019~~ 2019-2020 fiscal year from the
6 Miscellaneous Agencies Fund Account designated for support of the Assessment
7 Coordination Department to the Real Property Reappraisal Fund. The total of
8 all transfers shall not exceed \$1,500,000.

9 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2018~~
10 2019 through June 30, ~~2019~~ 2020.

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12 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
13 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
14 PROVISION. After receiving approval from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
15 State, the Director of the Assessment Coordination Department is authorized
16 to transfer appropriation from the Operating Expenses line item in the State
17 Operations Program to the Assessor's School special line item to assure
18 sufficient resources are available to provide required training for
19 assessment personnel.

20 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2018~~
21 2019 through June 30, ~~2019~~ 2020.

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23 SECTION 11. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
24 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
25 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
26 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
27 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
28 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
29 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
30 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
31 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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33 SECTION 12. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
34 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
35 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
36 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive

1 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
2 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
3 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
4 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
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6 SECTION 13. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
7 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
8 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
9 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2019 is essential to the operation of
10 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
11 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
12 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2019 could work irreparable harm
13 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
14 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
15 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
16 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2019.
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
