AN ACT TO REQUIRE TRAINING CONCERNING A LAW
ENFORCEMENT OFFICER'S DUTY TO INTERVENE WHEN THE LAW
ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OBSERVES THE USE OF EXCESSIVE
FORCE BY ANOTHER LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER; AND FOR
OTHER PURPOSES.

*TO REQUIRE TRAINING CONCERNING A LAW
ENFORCEMENT OFFICER'S DUTY TO INTERVENE
WHEN THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OBSERVES
THE USE OF EXCESSIVE FORCE BY ANOTHER LAW
ENFORCEMENT OFFICER.*

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 12, Chapter 9, Subchapter 1, is amended to add an additional section to read as follows:

12-9-125. Duty-to-intervene training.

In accordance with the certification requirements of the Arkansas Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training, all law enforcement officers in the state shall complete annual training related to a law enforcement officer's duty to intervene if the law enforcement officer observes the use of excessive force by another law enforcement officer.
