SENATE RESOLUTION

TO EXTEND THE FIRST EXTRAORDINARY SESSION OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO CONSIDER ONE (1) OR MORE BILLS TO PROVIDE PROTECTIONS FOR CITIZENS BY ESTABLISHING RIGHTS TO PRIVACY, LIABILITY, OR OTHER PROTECTIONS THAT ARE OTHERWISE RELATED TO DISCRIMINATION REGARDING CORONAVIRUS 2019 (COVID-19) VACCINES.

Subtitle

TO EXTEND THE FIRST EXTRAORDINARY SESSION OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO CONSIDER ONE (1) OR MORE BILLS TO PROVIDE PROTECTIONS FOR CITIZENS RELATED TO CORONAVIRUS 2019 (COVID-19) VACCINES.

WHEREAS, Arkansas Constitution, Article 6, § 19, provides that, after the General Assembly has disposed of the business set forth in the Governor's proclamation to convene an extraordinary session, the General Assembly may, by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all the members elected to both houses, remain in session for a period not to exceed fifteen (15) days for the purpose of transacting other legislative business; and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly has disposed of the matters set forth in the Governor's proclamation calling the First Extraordinary Session of the Ninety-Third General Assembly,



NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

THAT the First Extraordinary Session of the Ninety-Third General Assembly has completed action deemed to be necessary with respect to the business set forth in the Governor's proclamation to convene the extraordinary session.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the First Extraordinary Session of the Ninety-Third General Assembly is extended in accordance with Arkansas Constitution, Article 6, § 19, and shall remain in session for a period not to exceed fifteen (15) days to consider one (1) or more bills to provide protections for citizens by establishing rights to privacy, liability, or other protections that are otherwise related to discrimination regarding coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) vaccines.
