WHEREAS, the Commonwealth of Nations is an association of fifty-six (56) sovereign nations that support each other and work together towards international goals; and

WHEREAS, membership in the Commonwealth of Nations will provide the United States with a number of economic and diplomatic benefits; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth of Nations is a diverse and influential group of countries that collectively account for a significant portion of global trade and economic activity. By joining the Commonwealth of Nations, the United States will have the opportunity to strengthen its economic ties with these countries and potentially increase trade and investment; and

WHEREAS, in addition to economic benefits, membership in the Commonwealth of Nations will also enhance the United States' diplomatic standing on the global stage. The Commonwealth of Nations is a forum for member countries to engage in dialogue and cooperation on a wide range of issues, including human rights, democracy, and development. By joining the Commonwealth of Nations, the United States will have the opportunity to work with other member countries to address global challenges and promote mutual

WHEREAS, joining the Commonwealth of Nations will help to strengthen the country's cultural ties with other nations. NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

THAT the House of Representatives encourage the United States Congress and the President of the United States to have the United States become a member of the Commonwealth of Nations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT upon adoption of this resolution, an appropriate copy be provided by the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives to the majority leader of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, members of the Arkansas congressional delegation, and the President of the United States.
