### **For An Act To Be Entitled**

AN ACT CONCERNING THE USE OF PHYSICAL FORCE; TO AMEND  
THE LAW WITH RESPECT TO CIRCUMSTANCES THAT JUSTIFY  
THE USE OF PHYSICAL FORCE UPON ANOTHER PERSON; AND  
FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

### **Subtitle**

TO AMEND THE LAW WITH RESPECT TO  
CIRCUMSTANCES THAT JUSTIFY THE USE OF  
PHYSICAL FORCE UPON ANOTHER PERSON.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 5-2-601, concerning definitions with regard to justifications for the use of physical force upon another person, is amended to add an additional subdivision to read as follows:

(10) "School employee" includes a person employed by a school under a written contract, which shall include a:

(A) Classified school employee; and

(B) Licensed school employee.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 5-2-605(1), concerning the use of physical force upon another person that is considered justifiable, is amended to read as follows:

(1) A parent, ~~teacher~~ school employee, guardian, or other person entrusted with care and supervision of a minor or an incompetent person may use reasonable and appropriate physical force upon the minor or incompetent



person when and to the extent reasonably necessary to maintain discipline or to promote the welfare of the minor or incompetent person or if the parent, school employee, guardian, or other person entrusted with care and supervision of the minor or the incompetent person is authorized by § 5-2-606 to use physical force on the minor or incompetent person;
