AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES AND OPERATING EXPENSES FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS, HERITAGE, AND TOURISM - STATE PARKS AND TOURISM DIVISIONS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2024; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Subtitle

AN ACT FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS, HERITAGE, AND TOURISM - STATE PARKS AND TOURISM DIVISIONS APPROPRIATION FOR THE 2023-2024 FISCAL YEAR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE – CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code § 25-43-1304, concerning the creation and leadership of the State Parks Division of the Department of Parks, Heritage, and Tourism, is amended to codify special language in appropriation acts and to add additional subsections to read as follows:

(d)(1) Before July 1 of each fiscal year, the division shall request that the Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint Budget Committee, review the division's plan for the upcoming year regarding the amounts to be disbursed for each state park or other entity from the funds appropriated to the division for state operations.

(2) The division's request under subdivision (d)(1) of this section shall also list:

(A) The amounts to be distributed for each entity for the upcoming fiscal year compared to both the current fiscal year's anticipated expenditures and the previous fiscal year's actual expenditures; and

(B) Any additional detail as may be requested by the Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint Budget Committee.

(e) The division shall prepare a semiannual status report for the Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint Budget Committee, that compares the six-month and fiscal year actual expenditures to intended disbursements that the Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly was in session, the Joint Budget Committee, reviewed under subsection (d) of this section.

SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL MAINTENANCE. The funds appropriated in the Conservation Tax Operations appropriation section of this act for the Division of Arkansas State Parks Special Maintenance shall be expended, after receiving prior approval by the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, for a special maintenance program for the Park System. The funds provided will be used for repair and upkeep of parks and museum facilities that have been deferred due to lack of funds in the individual budgets of the parks and museums.

Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year

is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that the Division of Arkansas State Parks may operate more efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the Department of Parks, Heritage and Tourism authorizing broad powers under this section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section or the Special Maintenance line item. If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section and the Special Maintenance line item in the Conservation Tax Operations appropriation section is void.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2022~~ 2023 through June 30, ~~2023~~ 2024.

SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CASH PRIZES - STATE PARKS. The Division of Arkansas State Parks is hereby authorized to award merchandise, gift certificates and cash prizes to contestants in various special events authorized by the Division Director of the Division of Arkansas State Parks. Such prizes may be awarded to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize winners and shall be payable from the maintenance and operation line item of the Parks - Cash Fund Operations appropriation section. The cash prizes, in aggregate, for all contests, shall not exceed \$10,000 per fiscal year.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2022~~ 2023 through June 30, ~~2023~~ 2024.

SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. MISSISSIPPI RIVER DOMESTIC - INTERNATIONAL MARKETING PLAN. Of the funds appropriated to the Division of Arkansas Tourism - Great River Road for

operating expenses in the State Operations appropriation section of this act, up to \$15,000 each year is authorized to be utilized for the implementation of the Mississippi River Domestic - International Marketing Plan.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2022~~ 2023 through June 30, ~~2023~~ 2024.

SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code § 25-43-1309, concerning the purchase of uniforms of the Department of Parks, Heritage, and Tourism, is amended to codify special language in appropriation acts and to add additional subsections to read as follows:

25-43-1309. Purchase of uniforms.

(a) The Department of Parks, Heritage, and Tourism, including any of its divisions, may use funds appropriated for maintenance and general operations to purchase:

- (1) Uniforms for parks personnel;
- (2) Uniforms for Division of Arkansas Heritage personnel;
- (3) Uniforms for Division of Tourism personnel; and
- (4) Uniforms to be used by employees of the department who are staffing sports shows, travel shows, or other special promotional programs or special theme costumes.

(b) Any clothing purchased under subsection (a) of this section shall:

- (1) Remain the property of the department; and
- (2) Be surrendered to the department upon either the department's request or the termination of employment of the individual to whom the clothing was issued.

SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code § 15-11-406 is amended to codify special language in appropriation acts to read as follows:

15-11-406. Grants from Department of Parks, Heritage, and Tourism.

(a)(1) Upon approval of the State Parks, Recreation, and Travel Commission, the Department of Parks, Heritage, and Tourism ~~is authorized to~~ may make grants from funds specifically appropriated for such purposes to regional tourist promotion agencies, to assist such regional tourist promotion agencies in the financing of promotional and advertising programs, and to encourage and stimulate tourist travel and vacation business within

the natural planning region.

~~(b)(2)~~ However, before any such Before a grant under subdivision (a)(1) of this section may be made:

~~(1)(A)(i)~~ The regional tourist promotion agency shall have made application to the commission or the department for such a grant and shall have set forth therein the promotion and advertising program and project proposed to be undertaken for the purpose of encouraging and stimulating the tourist travel and vacation business within the natural planning region.

~~(B)(ii)~~ The application shall further state, under oath or affirmation, the amount of funds held by or committed or subscribed to the regional tourist promotion agency for application to the purposes described in this section and the amount of the grant for which application is made; and

~~(2)(A)(B)(i)~~ If after review of the application the commission is satisfied that the program of the regional tourist promotion agency appears to be in accord with the purposes of this subchapter, the commission shall authorize the making of a matching grant to the regional tourist promotion agency equal to the funds of the regional tourist promotion agency allocated by the regional tourist promotion agency to the program described in the application.

~~(B)(ii)~~ However, the state grant shall not exceed an amount equal to the total amount apportioned to the natural planning region as outlined in this subchapter.

(b)(1) Funds appropriated to the department for tourism or museum grants may be used to make grants to cities and counties for the purpose of feasibility studies for tourism attractions.

(2) A grant made under subdivision (b)(1) of this section shall:
(A) Be on a one-to-one dollar matching basis; and
(B) Not exceed fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) in state funds per grant.

(3) The department may promulgate rules to administer the grant program under subsection (b) of this section.

(4) After awarding a grant under this subsection, the secretary shall notify members of the General Assembly who represent the district in which the grantee is located.

SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE – CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code § 15-11-205, concerning the powers and duties of the Secretary of the Department of Parks, Heritage, and Tourism, is amended to codify special language in appropriation acts and to add an additional subsection to read as follows:

(d)(1) The department may enter into contracts with department employees for the provision of golf lessons at the department’s golf courses if the:

(A) Lessons occur outside of the employee’s normal working hours;

(B) Employee is a Class A member or apprentice of the Professional Golfers’ Association of America or the Ladies Professional Golf Association; and

(C) Director of the Division of State Parks has approved the contract as being in accordance with department standards and procedures for concession and operating contracts.

(2) Compensation to employees under subdivision (d)(1) of this section does not count toward determining retirement system benefits.

SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SMALL FESTIVAL FUNDING. The General Assembly acknowledges the economic benefits of festivals which attract visitors and stimulate the growth of tourism and businesses statewide.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law or rules and regulations promulgated by the Department of Parks, Heritage and Tourism to the contrary, the Department of Parks, Heritage and Tourism shall dedicate, commit and budget annually one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) from the 2% tourism tax credited to the Tourism Development Trust Fund for expense, advertising, marketing or grants for small festivals in Arkansas communities of less than 10,500 people. Any funds not granted out in a fiscal year shall be available for other tourism promotion efforts.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2022~~ 2023 through June 30, ~~2023~~ 2024.

SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA HELP. The Department of Parks, Heritage and Tourism may utilize their authorized extra-help positions and contract labor event staff up to a maximum of one thousand eight hundred (1,800) hours during seasonal events at War Memorial Stadium. The rates of pay may not exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification Act, or its successor, for the appropriate classification.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2022~~ 2023 through June 30, ~~2023~~ 2024.

SECTION 27. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 28. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 29. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2023 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2023 could work irreparable harm

upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2023.
