WHEREAS, on November 7, 2024, the Maumelle Charter High School Falcons boys' cross country team won their first Class 3A Boys' State Championship at Oaklawn Park in Hot Springs; and

WHEREAS, the Falcons team won the Class 3A Boys' State Championship with a team score of fifty-six (56); and

WHEREAS, the Falcons finished with three (3) team members in the top ten (10) and four (4) team members earning All-State Honors; and

WHEREAS, of one hundred eighty-five (185) total competitors in the Class 3A Boys' State Championship, the following Falcons team members placed as follows:

- (1) Caleb McFarland finished second;
- (2) Christian McGill finished sixth;
- (3) Roth Williamson finished seventh;
- (4) Griffin Meeks finished eighteenth; and



(5) Gabe Reed finished twenty-ninth; and

WHEREAS, the Falcons team consisted of nine (9) total athletes: Caleb McFarland, Christian McGill, Roth Williamson, Griffin Meeks, Gabe Reed, Jonah Fuller, John Rose, Ethan Toland, and Lukuz Rodriguez; and

WHEREAS, the Falcons were led by Head Coach Dalton Diles and Assistant Coach Pam McGill, and the Falcons' athletic director is Tyler Posey; and

WHEREAS, Falcons Head Coach Dalton Diles said of the win, "We came up short last year as the runner-up; the guys had this meet circled all year long. Each of them trained hard and always encouraged each other",
